I have been here for 20 days, everything is peaceful and thankful. It is a big help that I was living here for 5 months in spring 2008 when I took Candidate Orientation.

My daily routine is... I get up 5:30 early morning and worship God before starting a new day and then have breakfast with Korean ordinary meal such as cooked rice, Kim-Chi and soup. At 8:00 I do morning duty for example, cleaning a toilet and a corridor etc and then from 8:30 to 9:00 Bulstrode community we have morning chapel. It is time to begin working at 9:00 and 1:00 to 2:00 PM stop for lunch and then finish a daily work at 5:00. However, it often turns on the light in the OW office until early hours of the morning.

I started my work in Operation World on 14th December when I arrived here after 3 days. I met OW team members and felt a fellow feeling even though I never meet most of them except two members before. The 2010 edition of the book of Operation World will be published in summer 2010 so OW team is busy until then. At present, our team members are 12 in Bulstrode as I met and remote workers are 3 in Australia and New Zealand. The 15 members are working to make the exorbitant Christian Handbook, the book of Operation World.
